Business Buzz

- ▶ The province announced 30 new paramedics and three ambulances will be added in Nanaimo and its surrounding communities. The BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) says 24 full-time paramedics will be hired in Nanaimo. Parksville, Qualicum Beach and Ladysmith will all have two full-time positions created. The health ministry says the Nanaimo area is one of the first to be reviewed by the BCEHS because of high emergency call volumes and patient transfers and a low number of regular full-time staff. "With growing call volumes and few full-time staff this investment only makes sense," Health Minister Adrian Dix said in a release. "We are improving services the community counts on and ensuring paramedics are there when people need them." The province also announced improvements to staff scheduling for coverage at peak times. http://bit.ly/2sfjoka
- Nanaimo's most vulnerable and at-risk residents will soon have a new place to stay. The BC ministry of municipal affairs and housing announced Thursday a new \$7 million, 44-unit modular housing project will be built in south Nanaimo on Cranberry Ave., beside Chase River Elementary School. Municipal affairs and housing minister Selina Robinson said in a release the province is paying for the cost of the development while the City is providing the land. "Solving the housing crisis affecting people in Nanaimo...won't be easy, but when we work together and work quickly, we can create safe, affordable homes for people who need them," she said. This project is similar to the existing Uplands Walk supportive housing project operated by Pacifica Housing, where quickly built individual units are stacked to look like an apartment complex. Dean Fortin, executive director of Pacifica Housing, said the new development will offer supports and services to help people re-organize their lives, such as making sure they get to specific meetings, set up and keep all their appointments and learn necessary life skills. There will also be group training and meal programs. It's hoped construction on the complex can begin this spring. http://bit.ly/2FNVb6i
- A proposed development which would transform the northern gateway to Nanaimo is one of three projects set to significantly boost housing stock in the city's north end. The City is reviewing a permit application for a three building, 146-unit rental apartment development on the empty lot at 6975 Island Highway North, behind the Woodgrove Crossing Shopping Centre. Lainya Rowett, the City's manager of current planning, said the four-storey buildings would add a long-awaited street presence on a "gateway property." She anticipated a development permit would come before Council soon. Councillors will be asked to approve a parking variance, reducing the number of stalls from the required 243 to 171. The developer indicated potential for a phase two development on the same lot in the future. Rowatt said the property was previously zoned for commercial use, which would have prompted the need for improvements on Mary Ellen Dr. However, a residential development would draw less traffic and the only access to the site is off the Island Highway.

Meanwhile, two other notable north end projects are progressing. On January 15, Council approved a development permit for a four-storey, 59-unit rental project at 5085 Uplands Dr. A parking variance allowing for 30 less spaces than required was also approved for the development behind Northridge Village....Staff are also reviewing an application for two, five-storey buildings with 98 multi-family units and some commercial space at 6540 Metral Dr., across from Home Depot. That application has yet to go to Council and will require a parking variance of 61 less than required. All of the proposals still require building permits. http://bit.ly/2nF4XAS

Hundreds of people with disabilities will be able to achieve greater independence and find meaningful employment, thanks to the extension of the Province's popular Technology@Work program.

More than 1,140 people have already accessed Technology@Work, where people with disabilities can get the assistive technology they need for employment. A \$2 million investment from the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction and \$1 million from the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training will support the one-year extension of the program, which has been operated by the Neil Squire Society since May 2015.

The program has provided assistive technologies, such as mobility supports, alternative keyboards, voice input equipment and workplace modifications to people province wide. The Neil Squire Society also provides expertise and advice to employers who are, or want to be, more accessible and inclusive.

"We are excited that the Province of British Columbia has extended this important program," said Gary Birch, executive director of the Neil Squire Society. "We look forward to continuing to provide our expertise in assistive technology and ergonomics to workers and volunteers across British Columbia."

- September 2017 marked the fourth-annual Disability Employment Month in BC, celebrating the contributions of people with disabilities in the workforce, and the employers and communities who support their success.
- About 334,000 British Columbians, ages 15 to 64, self-identify as having a disability.
- There are 84 WorkBC Employment Services Centres throughout the province that serve British Columbians, including people with disabilities.
- The President's Group, an advisory group to government, is a change-driven network of 22 BC business leaders committed to working with private sector employers to help increase employment opportunities for people with disabilities.
- 47% of Canadians with disabilities aged 15 to 64 years are employed, compared to 74% of people without disabilities.

Ouick Facts:

The BC film and TV sector's last fiscal year can be summed up in one word: blockbuster. Production volume on the West Coast reached an all-time high of \$2.991 billion in the 2016-17 fiscal year, according to the Profile 2017 report released February 2 by the Canadian Media Producers Association (CMPA). Gains in foreign productions totalled more than \$700 million, while domestic productions increased by \$100 million last year, helping BC overtake Ontario as the largest centre for film and TV production. BC accounted for 36% of production volume in Canada compared with Ontario's 35% (\$2.977 billion). BC also surpassed Ontario in terms of employment after year-over-year job growth increased 39.5% from 43,620 full-time equivalent jobs to 60,870 full-time jobs. Meanwhile, Canadian TV productions from producers based in BC increased 26% to \$504 million, while the volume of theatrical films from local producers increased 92.7% to \$79 million. http://bit.ly/2E3zwKN
