A criminal record suspension program in B.C. has its eyes set on helping the many people formerly incarcerated who struggle to find jobs, homes and reintegrate back into society.

#### New supportive employment services help people in recovery

People recovering from mental-health and addiction challenges will benefit from a new \$4.9 million pilot program that integrates employment services within treatment and recovery centres. Five centres have been selected to participate, including **Connective** in Nanaimo (15 beds).

#### Canada launches new immigration process to fill 'in-demand' jobs

Healthcare, science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) professions; trades, (e.g. carpenters, plumbers and contractors); transport; and agriculture and agri-food are all sectors with *in demand* occupations. A recent adjustment to the immigration process supports recruitment of those seeking to immigrate permanently who have experience working in select roles. All Canadian residents are encouraged to seek training and employment in any of the over 80 in-demand occupations identified by industry.
