Pay transparency laws in B.C.

You may have noticed changes in how the wage information is published in job postings recently. The new Pay Transparency Act places requirements on employers to address systemic discrimination in the workplace, and one of the changes is the requirement to clarify wage information when advertising a job position. As of November 1st, the expected wage or salary, or expected wage or salary range must be included in the job posting. More information on BC's Pay Transparency Act can be found here.

Apprenticeship Recognition Month acknowledges skilled trades

The Province is celebrating Apprenticeship Recognition month as a record number of people have registered as apprentices in B.C., closing a crucial skills gap, and benefitting the economy. So far this year, 15,075 people in British Columbia have registered for apprenticeships, a 20% increase over last year. Although a great achievement, BC will still need significantly more skilled trades people over the next decade.

Indigenous tourism will benefit from workforce funding, training This fall, employers and people working in the Indigenous tourism sector will

be able to grow their skills and education through new programs designed to develop careers and strengthen the sector.

Fifty new teachers recruited to work in rural B.C. classrooms Kindergarten-to-Grade 12 students in some of B.C.'s rural and remote communities are learning this year from 50 new teachers who were recruited through the Province's new hiring incentives. Health Minister Adrian Dix recently announced that anew 306-bed longterm care facility will be built on Lantzville Road, beside May Richards Bennett Pioneer Park, and run by Island Health. The project is expected to be finished by 2027.

Mandatory Asbestos Certification

All workers in British Columbia covered by the regulation must obtain their asbestos abatement certification by January 1, 2024, to continue working on any site where asbestos is present. WorkSafeBC must also license asbestos abatement contractors by January 1, 2024, and ensure their workers are certified for their work by January 1, 2024.
